Meet Your Courtside Family!

What brought you to Courtside?

Being new to Florida in August of 2019, I didn't know anyone so I looked for an all tennis venue within a reasonable drive from the south part of Sarasota. After a 20 minute drive I was impressed with the modest clubhouse supporting nine clay courts that were busy with talented players. Clearly, it was all about the tennis at Courtside and I was excited at the prospect of being part of this group.

How long have you been playing tennis and why tennis?

I began playing tennis ten years ago. The racquetball courts seemed too physically crowded and not very safe. The tennis ball with its ability to accept spins coupled with the outside element aroused my curiosity. I never looked back.

Do you play other sports? Which ones?

Wiffleball was a sport I embraced as a kid and then fifty years later as an adult. When I retired in 2011 I decided to build a wiffle ball field in the vacant acre of land I owned behind our house. Previously a field that supported a variety of wild grasses I began defining the field dimensions using classic wiffle ball standards. With the help of a high school girl who lived on our road we began adding landscaping, a back stop, a wooden scoreboard that used hand posted numbers each half inning, infield art, and a flagpole. Over the course of the field's lifespan (6 years) we featured a variety of events including kids day with children as young as three while also embracing the older generation, many in their sixties. The remarkable quality of the field was that generational gaps seemed to dissolve once the players took the ball field.

Tell us about your family.

My grandmother was an influence on me growing up. She worked in the culinary department of the public school system and was a classic old school cook, everything from scratch. She knew how to bake, too. Not the fancy desserts we are used to seeing in today's modern cafes, more along the line of apple and cherry pies and, yes, cinnamon rolls.

Where have you travelled to and where would you recommend your fellow Courtside family travel to and why?

My wife, Susan and I have traveled to Martinique, a French island in the Caribbean, many times and always enjoyed the experience. The native population, coupled with a small transplant group of French citizens, is warm and welcoming to travelers. Snorkeling is wonderful, which is something my wife enjoys.

What did you do for a career?

I spent 25 years at the University of Michigan as their Executive Chef for Housing. It was a wonderful experience that stretched me in many ways.

What do you wish you knew more about?

I think the sea is a good answer to the question, "what do you wish you knew more about?", specifically aquatic behavior of the residents that we so seldom see.

What are some things people at Courtside do not know about you?

Some of my tennis friends are aware I'm writing a tennis novel about a young woman in her early twenties that is skyrocketing through the WTA ranks but gets an unexpected life change to deal with that has the potential to unravel her career goals.

I play the piano on a very intermediate level and take satisfaction in my baby steps progress.

What talent do you wish you had?

I wish I could speak fluent French. I love the culture and the sound of their language is simply music to my ears.

What makes you you? What is the best thing about you?

What makes me, me? I enjoy the challenge of allowing myself to evolve into the best person I can be.
